The Bishkek Declaration 2017 was adopted by 12 range countries during the International Snow Leopard and Ecosystem Conservation Forum in August 2017. This was followed up by the Kathmandu Resolution 2017 and Issykkul Statement 2018. To review and guide various elements of management and implementation of the Global Snow Leopard and Ecosystem Protection (GSLEP) Program, the fourth steering committee meeting is being organized in New Delhi.
